- Park Updates for NAC 7
  - Staley Park
    - Residents mentioned that there are dead trees at Staley Park. A tree is also half dead along Baker’s Alley.
    - Residents brought attention to poor drainage near the bottom of the park and basketball courts.
    - Residents suggest that the tables at the park pavilions be repaired.
    - Residents thank Parks & Recs for adding lights to the pavilions.
  - Monocacy Village Park
    - Restrooms are being winterized
    - LED lights are being installed at the Pickleball courts. The city offers pickleball classes in January 2023 for residents interested in learning how to play this increasingly popular sport
