POLICE REPORT: Presented by Cpl. James Dodson. Full report at end of document.

- Key points:
 - 1692 Calls for service
 - Proactive enforcement 486 patrol checks and 208 traffic stops
 - Lock your doors, lock your car. Keep anything of value out of sight in your car.
- Questions /Comments
 - Residents are concerned about issues with line of sight at corners, particularly on streets where there is street parking on both sides like Shafer and Key Pkwy.

NEW BUSINESS:

Fire Extinguisher Demo & Safety Chat - Independent Hose Company, Fire & Rescue Station #1

- How long does the average extinguisher last?
 - The expiration date will be listed on your extinguisher as this may vary depending on the model.
 - An ABC extinguisher has a powder-like substance in it. It is recommended you flip it over once every few months so that the fire retardant does not compact and stay in the bottom of the extinguisher.
 - When extinguishing stand back a good 10-15 feet. The ABC extinguishers can extinguish different types of fires
 - Class A) Plants and paper combustibles
 - Class B) Flammable Fuels
 - Class C) Energized equipment, Laptops, electronics, etc.
- How to use an extinguisher:
 - Pull - pull the pin
 - Aim - aim toward the fire
 - Squeeze - squeeze the handle
 - Sweep - use a sweeping motion to smother the flames with the powder
- Are the extinguishers refillable?
 - Most for residential use are typically not refillable. It's a one and done kind of thing. Once used it's practically trash, and you are recommended to dispose
- What do you do with an expired fire extinguisher?

- To properly dispose of the extinguisher, drop them off at the firehouse, or drop them off at the landfill.
- How many should you have?
 - At least one but in close proximity to potential area where a fire could break out. Some people will keep one if their kitchen and garage.
- Does your station have a hard time getting around the bike lanes?
 - No comment from Lt. Wiles.
- Main takeaway: Do not put yourself in any risk or hazard. Let the firefighters handle the big stuff.

Community Crime Notifications	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Lock doors and windows to your residence and vehicle. • Keep all items of value out of view (car/residence) and curtains/blinds closed. • Do not leave objects that could be used to break windows outside (rocks, bricks, etc.). • Investing in a doorbell camera and/or surveillance system provides a peace of mind and is great for identifying suspects and solving crimes. • Do not leave your vehicles unattended while running an unlocked.
