GUEST SPEAKERS:

- **Carol Krimm – Maryland House of Delegates, District 3**
Delegate Krimm was on hand to talk about the Monocacy ramp/interchange project. She said the project costs 61M and the interchange phase should be completed in April 2018. An interesting fact that many did not know is that Frederick County is in the top 4 urban freight corridors in Maryland. Another project that will be coming in the next few years is the Rt. 85 @ 270, which is slated for 2 years away at a cost of 112M.

She also reminded residents that project information can be found on the SHA website.

- **Rock Creek School Project – Beth Pasierb, Facilities Planning Supervisor for FCPS**
Beth was on hand to talk about the 7 site locations for Rock Creek School. Those include Tuscarora, Monocacy Elementary / Monocacy Middle, Walkersville Middle, Deerbought property, Ballenger Creek Middle, TJ Middle, and Valley Elementary. She said each site is being evaluated on a matrix. Rock Creek School has 120 students all of which are bussed in, 20 busses total. The new building will be 81,000 sq. ft. Recommendations will be made to the

school board on December 13th. Design and permit is expect to begin in January 2018 with construction to start February/March 2020 with an opening date of August 2021.
